MN JUNIOR PROGRAM

The Junior Program is offered to members exclusively. This Program is scheduled for eight consecutive Tuesday evenings beginning May 2. The lesson times will be 5:30 pm, 6:30 pm and 7:30 pm and will be grouped by age, with younger Juniors starting in the earlier time slots.

We will be covering all aspects of the game, including safety and etiquette.

MN COMPETITIVE JUNIOR PROGRAM

This year-long program off season, offers weekly instruction.

During the off season we focus on technical swing improvements, repetition and proper practice at LaunchPad Golf. Our focus during the golf season is a combination of weekly instruction and on-course training. This continues growth, aids with the transfer of skills to the course & exposes the golfers to pressure situations during tournament play.

Our Director of High Performance attends numerous events throughout the tournament season to provide support and feedback. This continual tournament support has been proven to benefit the performance of our tournament players. Our Director will provide feedback and coaching based on the observations of strengths and weakness that show up during competitive events.

We are excited to be a licensed Operation 36® facility! Op 36 is an app specifically designed for families. It uses a junior development model and gamified (fun) curriculum.

Our Golf Programs are centered around playing golf and making it fun to track practice & progress over time. We will leverage the Op 36 development model and technology to make it fun for our golfers to assess their skills as they progress.

Op 36 is also a communication tool! We will use it to assist with communication, track practice, establish goals and provide tools to guide your Junior outside of class and celebrate success through the community board.

OP 36 JUNIOR NIGHT

A big part of our Junior Golfer's progress occurs during practice and on the golf course; so, we will reserve tee times each Sunday afternoon for on-course play & progress assessment. A "tournament registration" will be sent out prior to sign up for the Sunday events.

A parent is required to keep score should their child be using the round as an official Op36 assessment round.

JR GOLFER LICENCE

Many of the Junior Golfers have a great time playing with their parents, but at some point, they may prefer to be playing with their friends. Once they have learned the finer points of etiquette, safety, and speed of play, they can earn their license to golf without adult supervision when:

12 years of age or older and have passed the Division 3 Operation 36 test and approved by the MN Professional staff.

2022 JUNIOR CODE OF CONDUCT & RULES

Mickelson National Golf Club takes pride in all of its members and facilities. Golf is a game of respect and honour for yourself, your competitors, and the golf course. The Code of Conduct below identifies the basic standards we require from our Junior Golfers at Mickelson National Golf Club.

DRESS CODE

Proper golf attire is required while using the golf facilities. This includes:

- Clothing worn in a neat and respectable manner
- Collared shirts for boys and golf tops or dresses for girls
- Tailored golf pants, capri pants, golf shorts or skorts for girls
- Boys shirts should be tucked in
- Jeans, sweatpants, short shorts, tank tops, or sleeveless shirts (boys) are not permitted
- Hats to be worn forward at all times

VIOLATIONS OF THE CODE OF CONDUCT

If a minor violation occurs, the individual will be prohibited from further participation until he/she complies with the above code. The individual must do so without delay and maintain the standard. Any actions considered serious may result in the individual being removed or excluded from any Junior Programs or activities until the incident is reviewed by the Professional Staff.
